- The academic 2015-2016 year began on 29/07/2015.

- All the perspective teachers are the members of the Red Ribbon Club, who develop awareness about the HIV / AIDS and reproductive and sexual health to the students of secondary schools where they do their internship.
- All the prospective teachers are the members of the Haritha Shobhitha (Eco Club). They develop awareness about environmental protection, pollution and responsibility to develop green belts.

- Our students supervised studies for the children of the CAP school (Child and Police Project) under the guidance of the lecturers concerned.
- The students made a visit to the Mano Vikas Kendra – a school for mentally retarded children, and observe their psychological functions and behavior. The students also observe the services rendered by the nuns to those children with special needs.
- They visited Nirmal Hruday – an old age home run by the nuns, and observed the old people and entertained them sportively.
