An exit questionnaire, as an annual feature was administered to the students. All the information regarding the facilities in the college, staff, teaching, evaluation, co-curricular activities, hostel facilities, general opinion about the college etc., was collected and basing on that necessary action was taken.

The students were unhappy about some of the facilities like water supply in the bathrooms and issue of books in the library. They felt that the above said facilities are not upto the mark. The students were also not pleased with computer practicals in the computer lab. Most of the students expressed their displeasure regarding the work load in the second term of their course. They felt that they were free in the first term and the work was heavy during the last term.

The students were happy with the teaching of the faculty members and the record work as it was considerably reduced in comparison with previous batches.

It was already decided that the labs would be kept open after the college hours also, thus giving chance for the students to visit whenever they wanted to. The hostel students, specially had an advantage over the day-scholars because they are on the campus all the while. On the whole the students are quite happy with the on going activities in the college.

The M.Ed.'s on the other hand are also quite satisfied with the course, facilities and faculty. Their only problem is the timings of the college. Many of them come from out

stations and they find it rather difficult to reach the college by 9.15 a.m. To solve this problem it was decided to have the first period during the day as the library hour and the theory classes would commence only from 10.30, thus giving ample time for all the students to get to the college in time for the classes and not miss any lectures.

Medium of instruction being English, is another hurdle for many students because they would have had their education till the graduation in Vernacular medium, and understanding classes in M.Ed. in English and expressing themselves in English, specially writing in English is very difficult for them and they get frustrated and even depressed. This difficulty is all the more when it comes to their writing their dissertation which is a compulsory aspect. Except rendering a helping hand there is nothing much that can be done
