ACTIVITIES OF THE COLLEGE

Best practices organized through different departments

KEAT'S CLUB

The department of English organizes various language & literary activities in addition to the class room teaching and assignment work. We named our Club 'Keat's Club'. John Keats was one of the romantic poets who died at a very early age. To remember his marvelous contribution to English Poetry, we have named it in his honour. The club conducts different programmes annually. To name a few, elocution, group discussions, essay writing, enacting skits, quiz etc., are conducted for all the English methodology students. Every year four of the students would be elected as President, Secretary, Joint Secretary and Treasurer to take responsibility of the activities and one of the faculty of English takes the overall responsibility.

LEELAVATHI CLUB

Progress and prosperity of a country are essentially linked with the outcome of the results of teaching of Mathematics in its schools. A teacher in the formal class room environment hardly finds time to go beyond the syllabus. Organization of useful activities through Mathematics club will be a good platform for exploration of all the aims and objectives of teaching Mathematics.

The fundamental aims of a Mathematics Club are to arouse interest in the students for the learning of mathematics and develop heuristic and creative potentialities of the students and to acquaint them with the latest knowledge.

The Mathematics department of St. Joseph's College of Education for Women, Guntur established "Leelavathi Mathematics the Club" which is named after the famous Indian woman mathematician Leelavathi who is the daughter of well known Mathematician Bhaskara charya. Every year many academic activities like guest lectures by eminent people in the field, mathematics quiz, symposia, solving of puzzles, riddles, magic squares, preparation of scrap book etc., are conducted by the club. Mathematics teachers along with student members constitute the club every year with the Principal of the College as patron of the club.

KAUTILYA CLUB

- Every year the Social Studies club is formed with the Social Studies methodology students. The office bearers like President, Vice-President, Secretary, Joint Secretary and a Treasurer are elected by the students from amongst themselves under the supervision of the methodology lecturer concerned.
- The functions of the Social Studies club are numerous. It organizes assembly every day and on national days like Independence Day, Republic Day etc. It also organizes debates and discussions on current events, extension lecture by subject experts or community leaders. It also plans for the students' extension activities, tours to historical places, field trips etc.

ALEXANDER FLEMMING CLUB (Biological Science)

Science has helped man to acquire supremacy over nature. Science in the literal sense means the pursuit of knowledge. The main intention of formation of our Science Club is to encourage bright and enthusiastic students having special science talent.

The skills and talents of the students are recognized and stimulated. Students will develop instincts of curiosity, creativity and construction. Students participate in group projects and understand the science concepts better. This in turn helps them to teach the subject confidently.

The various activities under this club are:

- Visit the science fairs and workshops held in schools and other Colleges of Education.
- To celebrate the birthdays of Scientists and important scientific events.
- Collecting paper cuttings of new inventions and discoveries. (these paper cuttings are displayed on the notice board)
- Preparing a scrap book. (each student will prepare a book with different topics)
- To arrange lectures by eminent educationalists (senior science faculty)
- Preparation and Exhibition of improvised apparatus, working models, 2 and 3 dimensional teaching aids. The best teaching aid is awarded a prize every year.

EINSTIEN CLUB (Physical Science)

Physical Science develops in the student training in scientific method and scientific attitude. It promotes practical application of science and encourages the pupils to try out their ideas and do creative work. It identifies

Talented and promising pupils and helps them in imbibing the habit of self reliance, self dependence and love for creative work.

There is an executive body elected from amongst the students consisting of a President, Secretary, a Joint Secretary and a Treasurer. The faculty members and the Principal guide the students.

- To develop in children a sense of healthy competition for a better cause.
- To contact other science clubs in the neighborhood and exchange views and information.
- To develop in pupils a keen eye for observation.

- Prepare albums, improvised apparatus etc.
- Conduct science fairs and project works.
- Maintain a bulletin board.

- Organization of competitions such as quiz and debates on topics of scientific interest etc.
