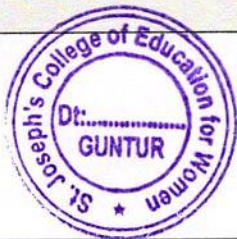

Earth day

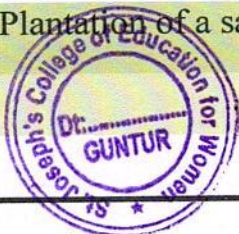

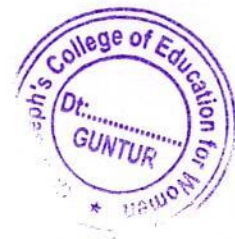

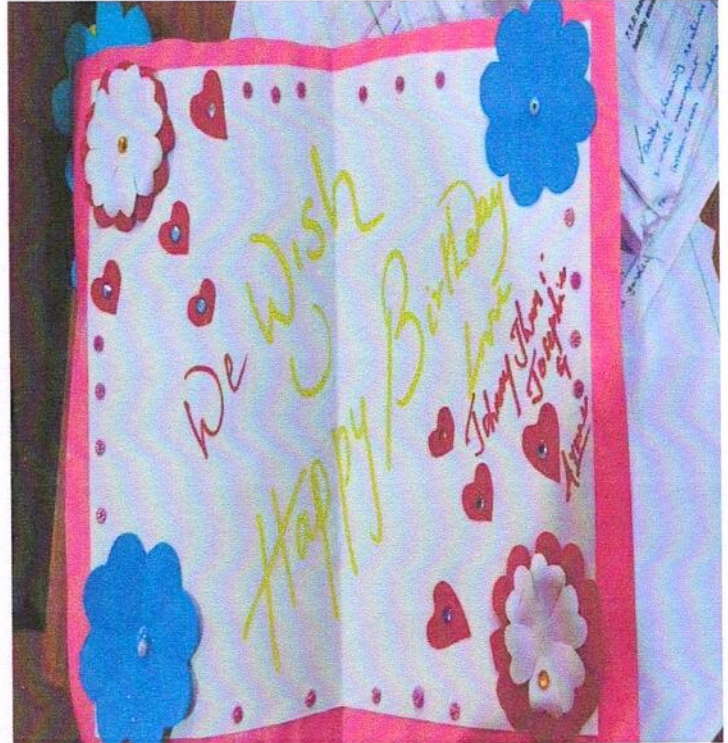
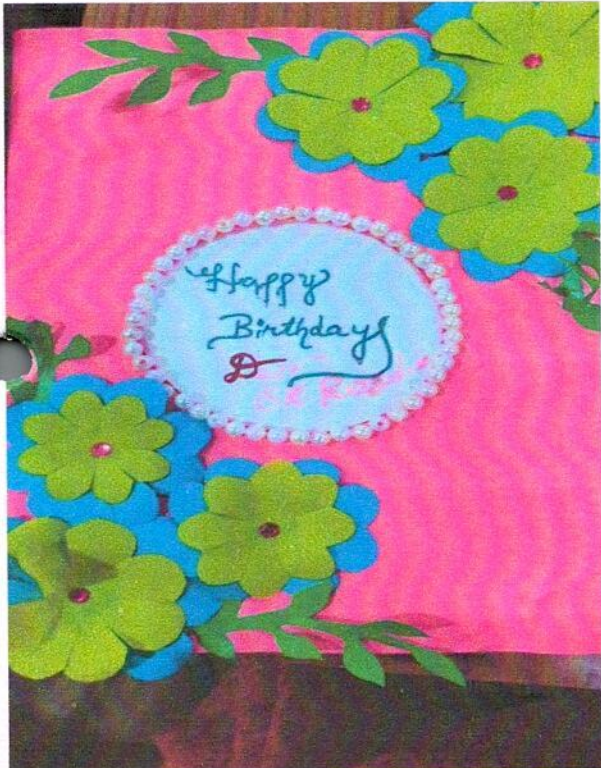
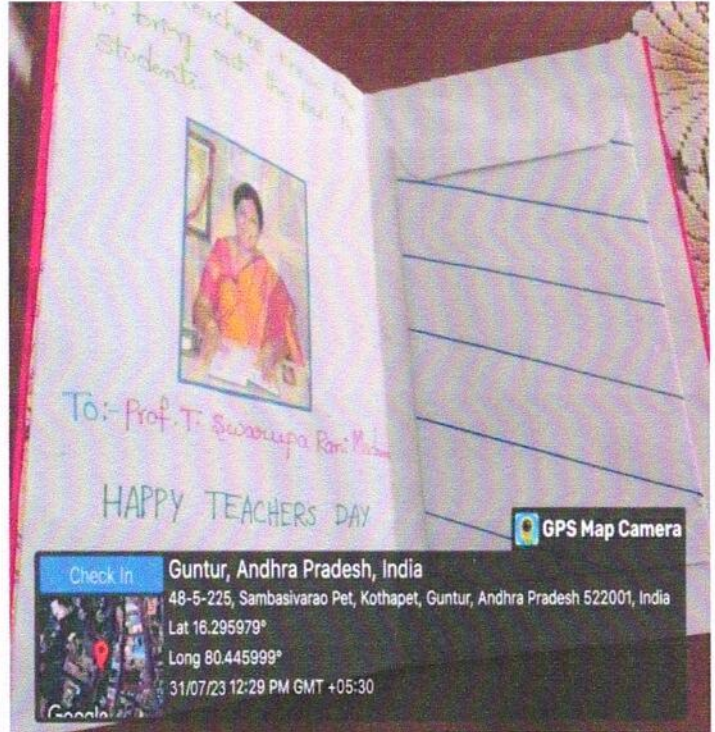
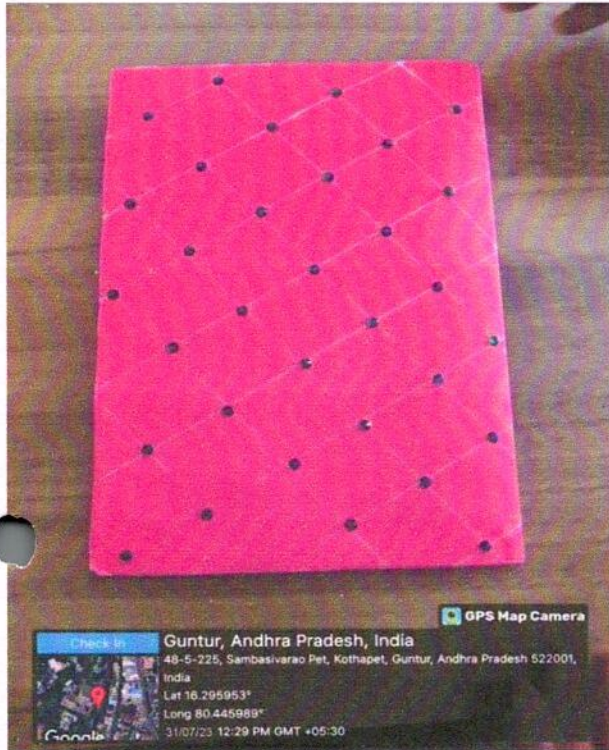
Preparation of Greeting /Invitation Cards by using of waste papers

To minimize paper usage, we have developed enterprises resources planning system for all academics and administrative activities. Additionally we collect the disposal of liquid waste from labs and washrooms through a well constructed drainage system.

In the terms of non-degradable waste management, and faculty members guide students on the proper use and handling of chemicals in the labs, we promote the use of less hazardous chemicals. We also disposal of water soluble chemicals through the sewage system after solubilizing them in water.

Moreover, we have banned the use of plastic on our campus to reduce non-degradable waste.

We wish that these policies will generate a cleaner and greener environment for all us to survival and work in. We support everyone to maintain these initiatives and help us to make a positive impact on environment.

- iv. Economical usage/ reduced wastage: the following programmes and activities are conducted to ensure economical usage and minimum wastage of water.
 - a. Water Recharging Pit: in the campus serves to maintain the water level of the wells and the water from the wells is used for various purposes in the hostel after purification via the water purifier.
 - b. Reminders by word of mouth is given to the staff and students to be judicious in the use of water.

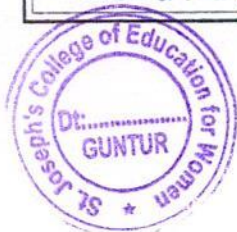
Sources of air Pollution In Our locality
