Awareness Programme on Waste and Water Management

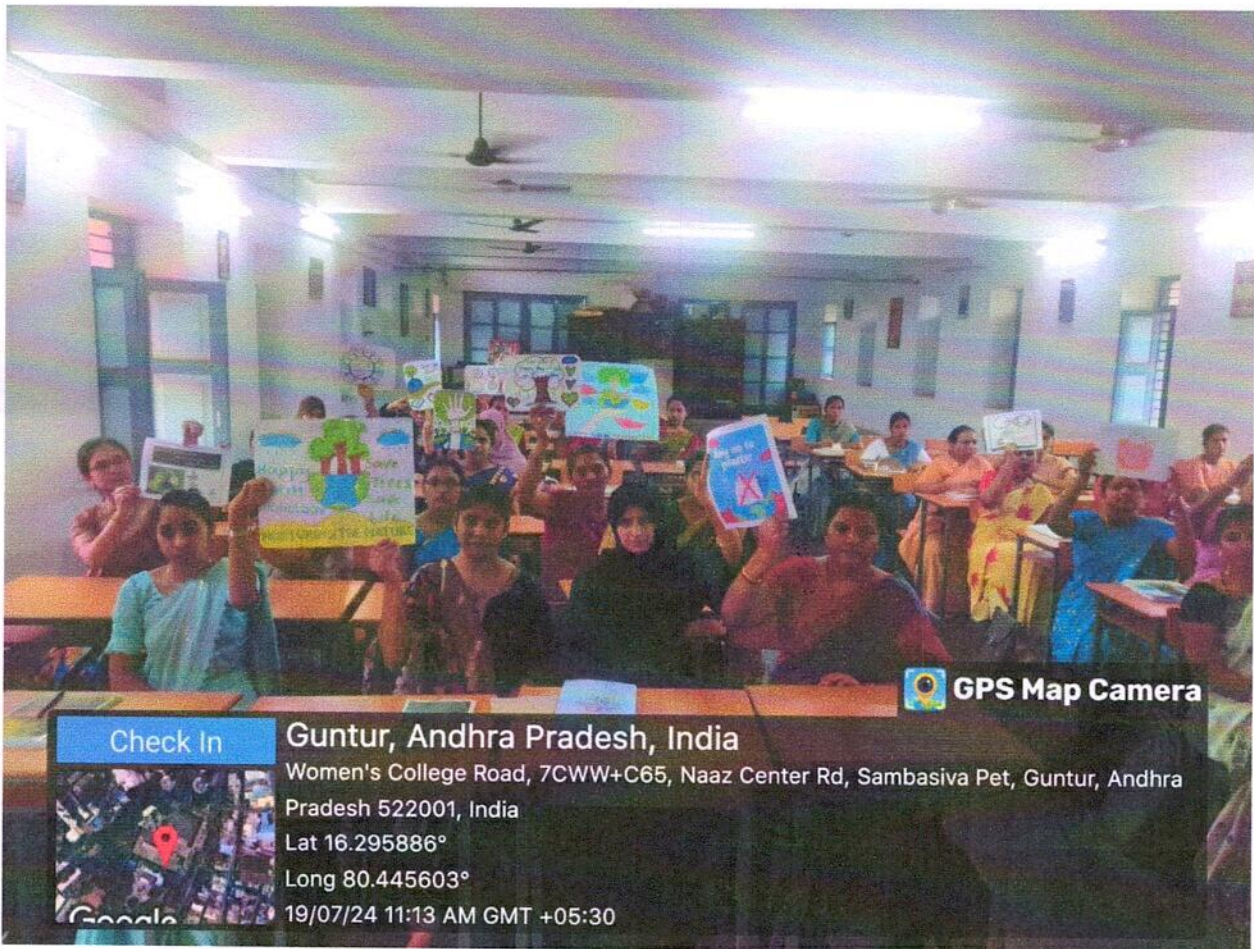

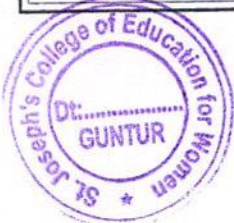
Sources of air Pollution In Our locality
